1. Koalatext

Justification:

Koalatext is a website with a lot of educational resources like videos, flashcards, reading comprehensions, audios, exercices... Everything ordered by topics and levels.

My choice:

I would use the video "Yes, I Can! | Animal Song For Children" (
https://www.youtube.com/watch?v= Ir0Mc6Qilo) from the Super Simple Songs youtube
channel. The song introduces animals and actions that they can or can't do. I think it is very
interesting because the verb "can" is a basic one, so it is one of the first things children learn at
a very young age. Through this repetitive song they can learn the correct grammar for
sentences like "I can/can't ______" without they even realising. Further activities can be done
to deepen this knowledge, like activities to start writing simple sentences and getting a first
contact with the written English. Moreover, this video opens new doors for further learning, such
as the actions that humans can or can't do, the animals, the action verbs, the different
environments (sea, jungle, classroom)... And it is also easy to make it significant by creating a
project out of it! There are a lot of schools that choose the name for their class, and many times
the classroom name is a name of an animal, or the jungle, etc... That could be the starting
point for introducing this song.
